

#### INVESTMENT REPORT SPORTS CARD BUYS OF THE WEEK: SEPTEMBER 11-18

Arch Manning: Panini Prizm Draft Auto Redemption Base Arch Manning is the new Shedeur Sanders. We've discussed Arch Manning several times in the recent weeks and Paul has planted his flag on Manning being the next surefire investment. The former #1 ranked prospect of his class currently sits 3rd string on a highly-ranked Texas Longhorn football team, meaning current hype is low and the runway is long. This is a hype play, and the hype will be very real through a number of different markers that could and will come into play over the course of Manning's college career. His cards are already going up without him even playing, so imagine what they'll do when he's named starter or erupts during his first breakout performance. Manning's Base Auto Redemptions are going for around \$320, and should see substantial gains once these markers hit.



## Lionel Messi: Sports Illustrated for Kids 2023 Miami Kit

Featuring in this month's Sports Illustrated for Kids magazine, Messi's 2023 Miami Kit card is his first MLS card, and his only print in the Miami kit. We're buying these in the \$10-15 range, and expect the price to go up once people start realizing SI for Kids has beat Topps to getting the first Miami kit Messi Card in circulation.



<u>Caleb Williams: 2022 Bowman University 1st Pink Refractor (Non Auto)</u> We've been preaching buying Caleb Williams University cards as a strong profit play for weeks, and today we'll be giving investors a more affordable option to make money with. Williams' 2022 Bowman University Pink Refractors in Raw can be scooped up for around \$20, while their PSA 10 counterparts are going for roughly 8x that figure. With gem rates being high here, this is a good spot to purchase raw and get these graded asap while Williams continues to make his push towards a second Heisman award and be ready to sell when he goes #1 in the NFL draft.



## Joe Burrow: 2020 Mosaic NFL Debut #261 PSA 10

Joe Burrow's performance against the Browns was one of the worst in recent memory for the popular young quarterback, as he threw for less than 100 yards and zero scores. Should there be cause for concern though? We don't think so, but his week 1 performance certainly didn't do his card market any favors. Use this lapse in Burrow hype as an opportunity to buy in and be ready to hold for an upcoming electric weekend performance. Burrow's 2020 Mosaic NFL Debut can be picked up for under \$75, a low number for a card that has spiked close to \$200 in the past. Joey B will continue to get better, and the Bengals will show they're still a legitimate Super Bowl threat, be ready to list then!



#### Dak Prescott: 2016 Prizm Silver #231 PSA 10

With the Cowboys' more than impressive Week 1 routing over the New York Giants, Dak Prescott is a player that has quickly spiked into our radars. While Prescott had a below average performance that included zero passing touchdowns and less than 150 yards, the Cowboys defense showed they will have the ability to keep Dallas in just about every game they play. Furthermore, VegasInsider has the Cowboys holding one of the highest projected win totals in the league. For years Prescott has struggled to move the needle for investors, but this year we may be looking at a legitimate shot for a deep playoff push led by the 8 year veteran. His 2016 Prizm Silver in PSA 10 recently traded for \$164, an absolute steal for a card that didn't drop below \$350 between August of 2020 and August of 2022.



### Drew Allar: 2022 Bowman Chrome 1st Prospect Auto

Drew Allar is one of our favorite college football fliers, which is why he's been recently added to our top football card investment plays. Allar has NFL-ready size at the quarterback position with an impressive arm to pair with a budding receiving corps under offensive coordinator Mike Yurich. Allar has already climbed the Heisman ranks in the first two NCAA weeks, and we like his 2022 Bowman Chrome 1st Prospect Auto in PSA 10 as play to make investors money.
